

ABOUT THIS CONFERENCE

More than ninety years after women in Ireland won the vote; only 15 per cent of Dáil Deputies are women. The Oireachtas used its Committee structure to explore the reasons in 2009 and 2010 and published two reports which identified the barriers.

Former Green Party Minister for Equality Ms. Mary White opened constructive dialogue with the political parties during 2010. Current Labour Party Minister of State for Equality, Ms. Kathleen Lynch T.D. has built upon this work, including through organisation of this Conference.

The new legislative measures being proposed by the Minister for the Environment, Community and Local Government will require the political parties to present more female candidates to the electorate or risk the loss of State funding.

This Conference is an opportunity for an open dialogue with international and national experts including academics, politicians, political activists, party administrators and party leaders about the steps that need to be taken to ensure that women are more equally represented in Irish political life in the future.
